Energizing the Life Insurance Market with hot new technology. Prior to investing in the eBusiness Platform, Helvetia Patria (HPV) was spending a significant amount of money and time to maintain multiple regional systems and connection points to communicate with its partners. Each system had different characteristics, processes, data, availability, timeliness. The architecture and processes lacked standards which prevented collaboration and synergies between groups and countries. Most of the work was accomplished manually through telephone, fax, post mail etc. The old architecture and systems' limitations forced the sales force and support staff into spending an inordinate amount of time on non-sales and back-office activities. This impacted overall performance and severely limited HPV's ability to scale.
